


CALL TO CONFESSION & PRAYER OF CONFESSION

OFFERTORY ANTHEM

I was absolutely honored to compose Glistening Spirit for today's celebration of Edward Landin Senn's Ministry of Music—commissioned by the Sanctuary Choir of Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church and marking his final Sunday as Assistant Director of Music. Given that Pentecost is also celebrated this Sunday, I chose to collaborate with librettist Euan Tait, whose vivid poetry evokes the Holy Spirit through imagery of light, water, and fire. Drawing melodic inspiration from the ancient Pentecost introit chant Spiritus Domini, the piece moves through three sections: the first portrays the Spirit in motion through vibrant imagery—"a glistening shimmer," "surface of fiery water," and "wild of light." The second turns inward, expressing our collective response as joyful song, building toward "fierce wingbeats." The final section, beautifully described by Euan as "our long, unfolding Amen," becomes a collective prayer of yearning that echoes the depth of our human experience. It gradually layers the chant's opening motive, rising to a luminous chord that symbolizes the joyful vitality brought by the Holy Spirit. As the texture recedes, three quiet iterations of the chant's Alleluia motive are shared among the voices before the piece closes in stillness, peace, and renewal.
